

- Arrive at Center Ave. The last intersection before your destination is N. Water St. If you reach Saginaw St., you've gone too far.



Self-Guided Tour: Bay County Historical Museum

321 Washington Ave., Bay City

The Bay County Historical Society is a non-profit organization that manages the Historical Museum of Bay County and cares for the Trombley Centre House located in Veterans Memorial Park.

The roots of the Bay County Historical Society be-

gan over 135 years ago when a group of citizens created the Bay County Pioneer Society to preserve the history of Bay County. While lasting less than two decades, this "pioneering" group of some of Bay County's most prominent citizens paved the way for the current society, which dates back to 1919.

- Depart and head toward Wenonah Park Place.
- Turn right onto Wenonah Park Place, DoubleTree by Hilton Bay City Riverfront on the corner.
- Road name changes to 6th St.
- Turn right onto Saginaw St.
- Turn left onto I-75 S. Bus/M-25/McKinley St.
- Arrive at I-75 S. Bus/M-84/Washington Ave. The last intersection before your destination is 9th St. If you reach 10th St., you've gone too far.

Self-Guided Tour: Bay City Antiques Center

1020 N. Water St., Bay City

If you plan to cover the whole building, come for the day. We operate in connection with Bay Antique Center, a two-story multi-dealer shop. Together we are 60,000 square feet of AWESOME. Lots of great dining can be found nearby when you need a break. You'll enjoy walking the streets and seeing the sights along the riverfront.

Self-Guided Tour: USS Edson



1680 Martin St., Bay City

Is a Forrest Sherman-class destroyer, formerly of the U.S. Navy, built by the Bath Iron Works in Maine in 1958. Her home port was Long Beach, California and she initially served in the Western Pacific/Far East, operating particularly in the Taiwan Strait and off the coast of Vietnam.

The keel for the Forrest Sherman class destroyer USS Edson (DD-946) was laid at Bath Iron Works in Bath, Maine, on December 3, 1956. EDSON is one of the relatively new ships of the U.S. Navy named for a U.S. Marine, in this case Major General Merritt Austin Edson.

On December 15, 1988, EDSON was decommissioned by CDR Gideon W. Almy, III, USN, the eighteenth and final Commanding Officer. EDSON then served for many years as part of the Intrepid Sea-Air-Space Museum in New York City, prior to be returned to the U.S. Navy.

- Turn right onto Wenonah Park Place, DoubleTree by Hilton Bay City-River-front on the ۲ corner.
- Road name changes to 6th St. ٠
- Turn left onto M-25/N. Madison Ave.
- Keep straight to get onto N. Madison Ave.
- Turn right onto Woodside Ave.
- Turn left onto Harry S. Truman Parkway.
- Turn right onto Marquette St.
- Turn right onto Ronald K. McGillirary
- Arrive at Ronald K. McGillirary. The last intersection before your destination is Marquette St.



Self-Guided Tour: Dow Gardens and Whiting Forest

Self-Guided Tour: Historical Sage Public Library

100 E. Midland St., Bay City

The Sage Public Library, now known as the Sage Branch of the Bay County Library System, was dedicated to the people of West Bay City, Michigan, in January 1884. It was a gift from Henry W. Sage of Ithaca, New York, who owned and operated one of the world's largest sawmills on the west

side of the Saginaw River in Bay City.

- Continue onto Veterans Memorial Bridge
- Continue onto E. Jenny St.
- Fellow S. Wenonah St. to E. Midland St.
- Turn right onto S. Wenonah St.
- Turn right onto E. Midland St. Destination will be on the right.



State Theatre

913 Washington Ave., Bay City

History of the State Theatre

Bijou (1908-1927)

The building was originally constructed in 1908 and was known as the Bijou Theatre. The Bijou had a full stage and flyloft and served a variety of live entertainment in the form of Vaudeville and Burlesque shows. Around the late twenties, due the rising popularity of film, the theatre was converted to a movie house and renamed the Orpheum.



Bay Theatre (1930-1960)

In 1930, the structure received a major facelift bringing the interior to the form today. The stagehouse was abandoned in favor of movie screen. Much of the original structure still exists, buried under the walls of the current theatre. The theatre once again acquired a new name along with its makeover, becoming the Bay Theatre.

State Theatre (1960-2000)

In the 1960's, the original Bay Marquee with its Mayan motif was replaced and the name changed once again to the State Theatre, as it is known today. The new marquee was much more modern, matching the look of many other move houses and theatres of that time. The building was acquired by the Butterfield Theatre chain and was in need of some maintenance. The chain painted everything in the theatre with the same shade of brown, completely covering the Mayan artwork.

Recent History (2000-Present)

In 2000, the building was saved from the wrecking ball by the DDA and a group known as the Friends of the State Theatre. They brought the theatre back to life and began seeking donations and federal grants to raise the funds needed for capital improvements. Since that time, the

interior of the theatre has been restored to the 1930s look and the lighting, sound and HVAC systems have all been brought up to current standards. Patrons may now enjoy live and film entertainment in a state-of-the-art facility.




